Biblical Leadership: Elders and Deacons (Part Two)

Why do a series on elders and deacons:

Because it's important to understand how Jesus has set up His church. Because we need to raise up more elders. Because we need to raise up deacons. Because we have been learning more about eldership.

Elders are men who are responsible to Jesus Christ to lead, teach, protect, and equip His Church. Deacons are women and men who have recognized positions of service in the church.

More about elder qualifications: (Titus 1:3-9)

Can a single man be an elder? (v.6) Could Paul have been an elder? Jesus?

Must an elder's children be believers? (v.6) Compare the requirements of elders' children in 1 Tim 3:4-5.

Be prayed-in on a Sunday morning


