Biblical Leadership: Elders and Deacons (Part Three)

Why do a series on elders and deacons:

Because it's important to understand how Jesus has set up His church. Because we need to raise up more elders. Because we need to raise up deacons. Because we have been learning more about eldership.

The New Testament church had two offices, elder-overseers, and deacons (Phil 1:1).

What do deacons do?

"Deacon" is the Greek word for helper or servant. (Phil 1:1) So deacons have official positions of service in the church. Luke gives us an example in Acts 6:1-6.

Why do we believe deacons are both women and men?

In 1Tim 3:11 "their wives" can also be translated "women." So is Paul talking about deacon's wives, or about women deacons? Three reasons we believe it's women deacons:

- 1. Paul's word choice most naturally refers to women deacons.
- 2. There's no special requirements for elders' wives.
- 3. Romans 16:1 probably describes a woman deacon.

Why is it important to recognize deacons?

Because the NT sees this as important (Phil 1:1). Because this will help us make sure those serving as deacons are qualified (I Tim 3:8-12).

Because this will enable those serving as deacons to se appropriately commended and encouraged (1 Tim 3:13).

What does this mean for us?

We are all called to serve (Gal 5:13) How can empty hearts become serving hearts? (Mat 10:8) If you don't have a serving heart, spend more time receiving from Jesus.
