The Letter To The Hebrews By Faith Abraham Obeyed Hebrews 11:8

Introduction

Most Christians know from God's Word what commands we are to obey.

But many Christians have not seen in God's Word how we are to obey — what it is that enables us to obey.

In Heb 11:8 the author of Hebrews tells us how to obey.

But first, here's an overview of what he's been saying —

Jesus is God's Son who conquered death, sympathizes with us, & is the perfect priest & perfect sacrifice for our sins	Therefore draw near to God, cling to His promises, encourage each other, and stir up your faith in Him as your better possession	Faith assures us	Faith believes in God as Creator & brings His	Faith believes in God as Treasure & gives us righteousness	Faith conquers death &	Faith justifies us and helps us resist the world	Faith is how we obey

What did God call Abraham to do?

God called Abraham to leave everything and go to a land God would show him (Gen 12:1). This would have been costly. But Abraham did it — and obeyed.

How did Abraham obey?

Abraham obeyed by faith — by means of faith.

That means faith was HOW he obeyed — the way he obeyed would be by means of having faith — faith was what he would do in order to obey.

What does it mean to obey by faith?

Faith means trusting God's promises (Heb 11:1).

So to obey by faith, Abraham would have obeyed by means of trusting God's promises.

We can see that in Gen 12:1-3. V.1 is the command; vv.2-3 are the promises.

So obeying by faith would mean Abraham starts with trusting God's promises. This might mean having to fight the fight of faith with prayer and meditation on God's promises until his faith grew.


When he fully trusted God's promises, he would be motivated to obey.

The same is true with us — see Col 3:23-24; Gal 6:9; Luke 14:13-14.

What does this mean for us?

Abraham obeyed by faith — by means of trusting God's promises.

Let's follow his example, and do the same.
