Does God Know and Control the Future? Isaiah 46

Introduction

"Open Theism"	"Classical Theism"
God doesn't know all the future	God knows all the future
God doesn't control all the future	God controls all the future
Some trials we face are out of God's control.	Every trial we face is wisely and lovingly purposed by God to bring us great good.

How is God different from idols? (vv.1-7)

Idols need to be carried.

But God carries us like a father carries his son or daughter.

If we are trusting Christ, then at every moment God is carrying us — with loving affection, powerful support.

But this also means God is carrying us towards some future — so —

Does God know and control the future to which He is carrying us? (vv.8-11)

God knows every detail of the future (10a).

God controls every detail of the future (10b).

We can see this by what God did in foretelling and bringing about Cyrus' future (11).

What is the future to which God carries His people? (vv.12-13)

The future is salvation — more of God Himself now and forever.

This means that every trial is wisely and lovingly purposed by God to bring us the great good of even more of Him.

So be strong. Rest in God's love. Trust His purposes.

HOME GROUP DISCUSSION OF SUNDAY'S TEACHING

Is it good news to think that every trial will bring you more of Himself? Why or why not?

What's your take-away from this message? What are you going to do differently? When? How?
