# **Even More Encouragement for those Walking in Darkness Isaiah 52:1-12**

### Introduction

In Isaiah 50-52 Isaiah encourages Israel, who is enslaved in Babylon, to keep trusting God during a time when she is walking in darkness — when she knows that God has promised to free her, she is trusting God's promises of deliverance, but she's not yet seeing God fulfilling His promises.

This is something every follower of Jesus will experience, so we all need to learn from Isaiah about how to fight the fight of faith during times of darkness.

## What does God call Israel do to? (vv.1-2)

Israel is enslaved in Babylon. So how can Isaiah call her to put on beautiful clothes, shake off the dust, and cast off her chains? This becomes more clear in the following verses —

### What is God going to do for Israel? (vv.3-10)

God will redeem Israel from Babylon (vv.3-6)

God will personally and visibly return to Zion (vv.7-8)

This probably refers to the Second Coming, when we will see God face to face in the person of Jesus.

God will comfort and redeem His people in a way that all nations will see (vv.9-10)

This probably refers to the Second Coming, when God will raise us from the dead, cleanse us from all sin, welcome us into the new heavens and earth.

How do we become part of God's people? Only one way — by trusting Jesus Christ.

So when we are in darkness, we should focus on the promises that have to do with our immediate darkness, but we should even more focus on the promises of what God will do at the end of history, because that's when all darkness will cease forever.

# How do we do this? (vv.1-2, 11-12)

Wake up to what's in your future (v.1).

Put on strength and beauty and take off your chains (vv.1-2).

Depart from sin (vv.11-12).
