<u>The Letter To The Hebrews</u> God Guarantees His Promises Hebrews 6:13-20

Introduction

God has given us astonishing promises us what He will do for us through Jesus Christ. But how can we be sure God will fulfill His promises? In Hebrews 6:13-20 the author of Hebrews gives us three reasons we can be sure —

Because of what God did for Abraham (6:13-15)

God promised Abraham a child. Abraham patiently waited and trusted. And God fulfilled his promise to Abraham.

God will do the same for us.

Because God has shown His commitment by His oath and promises (6:16-18)

After Abraham had shown his trust in God by being willing to sacrifice Isaac, God repeated his promise to him with an oath (Gen 22:15-18).

So by two things — His oath and promises — He has shown that His promises are unchangeable. He will fulfill every one.

Because this hope is an anchor that will bring us into God's very presence (6:19-20)

"This" = the hope of God's promises.

This hope of God's promises is a sure and steadfast anchor of our souls.

AND when we cling to the hope of God's promises, we will have times when we enter the inner place behind the curtain — the holy of holies — where we experience God's very presence. **The Letter to the Hebrews**

What this means for us

We have every reason to cling to God's promises.

So — cling!
