<u>The story of God</u>: Justification by faith

GENESIS 15:6 — DEC 6, 2009

How can God bless Abram and every people group?

Galatians 3:8 — In Gen 12:3 God preaches the gospel to Abram—that he will justify the Gentiles through faith.

Justification is explained in Genesis 15:6 — God counts Abram's faith as a lifetime of perfect, moral righteousness.

How can a just God do that? Through what Jesus would do thousands of years in the future.

When Abram trusted God, God put all of Abram's sins upon Jesus so Jesus was punished by God because of Abram's sin; and God gave Abram all of Jesus' perfect righteousness so Abram was loved by God because of Jesus' perfect righteousness.

The only way Abram and any of us can be justified is by faith alone.

How can I be sure I have this kind of faith?

Abram's faith is illustrated in Genesis 12:1-3 —

Faith means understanding God's promises ...


So that I turn from what else I've been trusting for my satisfaction ...

And <u>trust</u> all that God promises to be to me in Jesus.

So — see God's promises — see who God is in Jesus — and turn to trust Him alone to forgive, change, provide for, and satisfy you in Himself.

And what can you do when you find that you have no faith? God promises to use His Word to give you faith (Rom 10:17).

So pray, and then feast on God as He's revealed in Scripture. Your faith will increase.
