

The Letter To The Hebrews Jesus Will Be Faithful When You Are Tempted Hebrews 3:1-6

<p>Cling to the Word about Jesus!</p>	<p>Because if you neglect it you will drift toward punishment, God has attested to its truth, Jesus won back our lost destiny, and He has freed us from the fear of death</p>	<p>Therefore consider Jesus' perfect faithfulness</p>
1:1—2:1	2:2-18	3:1-6

Why do we need to consider Jesus' faithfulness? (2:18-3:2)

The author has just told us that Jesus will help us when we are tempted (2:18).

So to make sure we understand that Jesus will always do this — he urges us to consider Jesus' faithfulness.

What does the author tell us about Jesus' faithfulness? (3:1-6)

1. Jesus is faithful to help God's people, just as Moses was (3:1-2)

So every time you face a temptation, Jesus will be faithful to help you.

2. Jesus is even more faithful than Moses, because as God He has power over everything (3:3-4)

Jesus is the builder of the house of God's people, but Moses was part of the house. And since Jesus is the builder, and the builder of all things is God, that means Jesus is God.

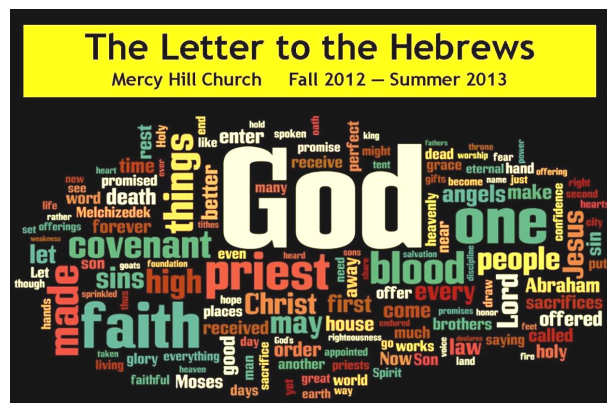
So no matter how strong the temptation feels, Jesus has the power to change your heart — and He will be faithful to do so.

3. Jesus is even more faithful than Moses, because as the Son He provides everything His house needs (3:5-6)

So when you are tempted, Jesus will be faithful to provide everything you need.

What does this mean for us?

Whenever you are tempted, cry out to Jesus to help you. He will always give you everything you need to resist the temptation.
