Telling the Truth Matthew 5:33-37

What is Jesus correcting? (vv.33-36)

He's not correcting the Old Testament. He's correcting the way the Pharisees distorted the Old Testament — verses like Lev 19;12 and Deut 23:21.

You can see their distortions in Matthew 23:16-19. They spent a lot of time talking about whether you could swear by lesser things and not have to tell the truth.

So what is Jesus calling us to do? (vv.31-32)

He is calling us to tell the truth (v.37).

But is he calling us to never use oaths? Some Christian groups, like the Anabaptists, drew this conclusion. But Jesus testified under oath in Matthew 26. And Paul calls God to witness that he is telling the truth (Phil 1:8).

So Jesus point is that if we are going to use a vow — be sure to tell the truth.

Jesus' disciples should always tell the truth.

How can we overcome lying?

Jesus says evil words — like lying — come from our hearts.

So lying shows evil in our hearts.

When we lie it's because we are trusting something else to satisfy us more than Jesus Christ (Psalm 84:11).

So to overcome lying — we need God's power to supernaturally change our hearts —

First — turn to God as you are — poor in spirit. Ask Him to forgive you through Jesus.

Second — earnestly ask God to change your heart by the power of the Spirit.

Third — pray over Scriptures which will help you feel that God is your all-satisfying Treasure.

As you do this you will feel the Spirit changing your heart so you desire Jesus Christ more than anything — and would gladly forego any other pleasure and endure any other pain to have more of Him.

The result is that we will tell the truth. Gladly.
