# The Letter To The Hebrews Let Us Draw Near To God Hebrews 10:19-22

#### Introduction

It would be strange to be hungry, go into a restaurant, read the menu, like the menu, but then close the menu and leave. But that's what many of us do with the Bible. We read what God offers, but then close the Bible and walk away.

In today's passage God tells us what He will do when we draw near to Him. So let's not just read this and close the book. Let's read this and press in to seeking Him, because of what He promises in Hebrews 10:19-22.

# What does it mean to draw near to God? (19)

Drawing near to God is described as entering the holy places — the holy of holies.

In the Old Testament the holy places is where God met with the high priest — where God made His presence real to the high priest.

So drawing near to God means turning from all else, and through Christ coming to meet God.

#### How important is it that we draw near to God? (19)

The word "therefore" in v.19 shows that what comes before gives us reasons to draw near to God.

And the reasons go all the way back through and including ch.5.

Note that the last verse of ch.4 is also a command to draw near to God.

So drawing near to God is important enough for six chapters' worth of Hebrews.

# Why should we draw near to God? (20-21)

Because we now have a new way to draw near to God (20)

Because we have a living way to draw near to God (20)

Because Jesus opened the way by dying on the Cross (20)


Because we have a great priest over the house of God (21)

## How do we draw near to God? (22)

With a true heart in full assurance of faith — by faith alone — expecting God to meet us.

With hearts cleansed from guilt — so we aren't self-righteous or despairing of sin.

With bodies washed with pure water — confessing all known sin and surrendering every area of our lives.
