More Encouragement for those Walking in Darkness Isaiah 51

Introduction

Every follower of Jesus will have times when we are trusting God, but are not yet seeing God fulfill His promises. At times like this we can be discouraged and disillusioned.

Isaiah writes chapters 50 and 51 to help Israel during a time when she is walking in darkness: knowing God's promises for the nation, but not seeing those promises fulfilled (50:10).

In ch.51 Isaiah gives 5 encouragements for Israel — and for us:

Remember that God brings about dramatic reversals (vv.1-3)


Understand that God's promises will surely be fulfilled (vv.4-8)

Call upon God with earnest, honest prayer (vv.9-11)

"If we don't get passionate with God in the face of disappointment, then cynicism slips in, and our hearts begin to harden. We begin a living death." Paul Miller, <u>A Praying Life</u>, p.198.

Overcome fear by remembering who God is (vv.12-16)

Wake up to how God's forgiveness guarantees the promise (vv.17-23).
