Grace-Based Marriage: Love May 17, 2009 Colossians 3:12-14

Introduction

"How do you revive a marriage of many years, when the love is gone? I've prayed to the Lord many times over this."

Love is different from romance.

Where does love come from?

What does it mean to love?

Vv.12-13 are all aspects of love (v.14)

Compassionate hearts and kindness (v.12).

Humility and meekness (v.12)

Patience, bearing with one another, forgiving each other (vv.12-13).

Where does this love come from?

From understanding, trusting, feeling that I am:

I am chosen by God (humbles me) (v.12)

I am made holy by God (encourages me) (v.12)

I am beloved by God (fills me) (v.12)

So how can I become more loving?

By sinking my roots deep into the truth that I am chosen by God, made holy by God, and loved by God because of Jesus Christ.
