Grace-Based Marriage: Sex June 7, 2009 I Corinthians 7:1-7

Introduction

One of the biggest problems in marriage is sex: expectations, communication, fulfillment. Jesus' grace can transform every area of marriage, including this one. I Corinthians 7 is a powerful passage Jesus can use to bring us His grace.

Sex is a good and holy gift from God for those who are married (vv.1-2)

V.1 is a quote from the Corinthians' letter; it's not Paul's statement.
The Corinthians had the idea that to be truly spiritual and holy you should avoid sex.
Paul strongly disagrees.
Sex avoids sexual temptation (v.2).
Sex is a good gift from God (v.7)
I Timothy 4:10-5
Proverbs 5:18-19
But sex is not essential, since singleness is also a gift from God (v.7)

Husbands and wives should seek to give each other sexual pleasure (vv.3-4)

V.3 — give you spouse his/her conjugal rights V.4 — let your spouse's needs determine what you do

Sex is a spiritual weapon (v.5)

Sex will thwart Satan's temptations.
