

## When will this outpouring of God's wrath happen?

Throughout chapters 13-23 we see two themes:

God's wrath will be poured upon each country at a specific time in their immediate future (example: 13:17-19).

God's wrath will also be poured upon the entire world at the end of history (example 13:9-13).

#### Why will God pour wrath on the entire world?

Through Creation God has clearly revealed himself to the whole world — so we all can see that God loves us, cares for us, has power to help us — so we should look to him for everything.

But the world would not look to God (22:7-11).

As a result, the world became evil, sinful, proud, and ruthless (13:11).

That's why God will pour His wrath upon the entire world (13:13)

# Is there any hope?

In these chapters there are many promises of God's saving mercy, like in 19:21-25.

God brings His saving power upon people one way — through us sharing with them the Gospel.

#### What does this mean for us?

See God's coming wrath, love those who are lost, and do whatever you can to share the Gospel with them.
