
God's Promise of Peace Isaiah 24-27

Why did Israel need to hear this?

It's because in her immediate future she faced being conquered by Assyria.



What does God promise to do?

God will keep them — and us — in perfect peace.

Perfect peace means no fear, worry, anxiety.

This is not something we manufacture; this is something God supernaturally gives. This is also taught by Jesus in John 14:17 and by Paul in Philippians 4:6-7.

How does God gives us His perfect peace?

He gives us His perfect peace as we fix our minds on Him and trust in Him. It is that simple; but it's not easy — because by His power we must overcome indwelling sin. So what do we fix our minds upon? The word "trust" shows that we fix our minds on God's promises.

What promises will God use to give us peace?


Trust that God will completely satisfy you in Himself (26:8-9).

In Himself; not in what He gives, but in who He is in Himself.

Trust that God will ordain peace for you (26:12a) He will orchestrate every event in your future to bring you the most heart-satisfaction in Him.

Trust that God will do for you whatever you need (26:12b)

Whatever you need in the future, God will give it to you.



HOME GROUP DISCUSSION OF SUNDAY'S TEACHING
