# <u>The Letter To The Hebrews</u> Be Grateful For The Unshakeable Kingdom Hebrews 12:25-29

#### **Introduction**

- Throughout church history, groups of believers have thought they figured out when Christ would return to earth, and bring world history to a close.
- But Jesus clearly taught that we would not know when He is coming back. What He wants us to focus on is what it means that He is certainly coming back.

In Hebrews 1225-29 the author of Hebrews tells us what will happen when Jesus returns -

## What is God speaking to us now? (vv.25-27)

- On Mt. Sinai God showed Israel what it would be like for sinful people to be in the presence of a perfectly holy and righteous God. At that time He warned them from earth that they needed a mediator a Savior.
- But now He warns us from heaven that in the future He will shake the heavens and the earth (v.26).
- That means everything that can be shaken will be removed and gone (27). All that will be left is the unshakeable kingdom (v.28).

That does not mean there will be no heaven and earth. God says He will destroy the present heavens and earth and replace them with the new heavens and earth of His Kingdom.

This truth transforms how we live our lives.

## How should we respond to this?

Don't refuse Him who is speaking (v.25)

Be grateful to God for receiving this unshakeable kingdom (v.28)  $% \left( 1-\frac{1}{2}\right) =0$ 

Offer to God acceptable worship with reverence and awe (v.28)
