Waiting Patiently for the Lord Psalm 119:81-88

Introduction

Because we are trusting Jesus Christ, God will always fulfill all his promises to us. But that does not mean God will always fulfill his promises WHEN we want him to. And during those delays, it's hard to wait patiently. To help us wait patiently, God gives us this passage in Psalm 119. The psalmist had been slandered by wicked men. He had prayed that God would deliver him. But God had not yet delivered him. So here are nine way is that he prays. I will explain them, and then we will take time here to actually pray them right now —

He tells God he longs to be delivered from the trial. (81)

He tells God that he is hoping in God's word. (81)

And call upon me in the day of trouble; I will deliver you, and you shall glorify me. (Psalm 50:15)

He seeks comfort from God and asks when it will come. (82)

He tells God how this is affecting him. (83)

He humbly asks God how long this has to go on. (84)

He tells God the details of the problem. (85)

He asks for God's help. (86)

He tells God he has not forsaken his word. (87)

He asks for fresh spiritual life so he can keep strong in faith. (88)



HOME GROUP DISCUSSION OF SUNDAY'S TEACHING
