Exo 20:3 — to rely on God alone to love, forgive, guide, provide, and satisfy them.

How did Israel respond?

Exo 32:1 — Israel turned their backs on God and made a golden calf to be their god.

How can anyone be saved?


Israel's hearts did not want God. So how can God save people who don't want Him?
