The Final Judgment and its Outcome Isaiah 45:20-25

What is Isaiah saying in these verses?

- 45:1-19 God has displayed who He is through fulfilled prophecies
- 45:20-22 Therefore turn to God and be saved
- 45:23 Because at the end of history everyone will willingly or unwillingly submit to God's Final Judgment
- 45:24 Some will end up not saved (compare how "ashamed" is used in Isa 41:11)
- 45:25 and the rest will end up saved.

What does the Bible teach about eternity?

Two views that are not taught in the Bible:

Universalism — the idea that in the end everyone ends up saved and in heaven. Matt 25:46 shows that there are two different eternal destinies: eternal life and eternal punishment. See also Dan 12:2; Matt 12:32; Mark 9:43-48; Rev 20:11-15.

Annihilationism — the idea that unbelievers do not suffer forever in hell, but end up ceasing to exist. The Greek word "destroy" can mean "cease to exist," but it also can mean to be lost, ruined, or continue to exist in a ruined state. See Rev 17:8; 20:10. Also Luke 16:19-31; Rev 14:9-11; Matt 25:46; 2Thess 1:9.

The Bible teaches that those who trust Christ will go to heaven forever, and those who persist in rebellion against God will go to hell forever.


How is God just to do this?

We have all persistently desecrated the infinite glory of God. Since justice means the punishment must fit the crime, the infinite crime of desecrating infinite glory requires infinite punishment.

What does this mean for us?

Flee to Christ and be saved.

Live in light of eternity.
