# The Letter To The Hebrews The New Covenant Hebrews 8:6-13

#### **Introduction**

Some passages in God's Word are easier to understand — some are harder. We can be tempted to focus on the easier ones and ignore the harder ones. But the Holy Spirit led the biblical writers to write both the easy and the hard passages. So if we are going to trust the Holy Spirit we will enjoy the easy ones — and study the hard ones. Hebrews 8 is a hard one.

## How does Jesus' Covenant compare to the Old Covenant? (8:6-7)

Jesus' Covenant is better, since it was enacted on better promises (6). The Old Covenant and promises had some fault (7).

### What was the fault with the Old Covenant and its promises? (8:8-9)

The author tells us by quoting from the prophet Jeremiah, who wrote at around 500 BC. The fault lay with "them" (v.8) — with the Israelites, because they did not keep the covenant. The vast majority of Israel never trusted God — they were not saved. (Although there was always a small remnant who were saved.)

So the fault with the Old Covenant and its promises lay with Israel — she turned away from God.

## **How is the New Covenant different?** (8:10-13)

In the New Covenant God changes people's hearts (10)
This means He causes us to want to repent and trust Christ.

In the New Covenant God is our God and we are His people (10b)

This means God devotes all of who He is to bringing us the greatest joy of knowing Him — And that we devote ourselves to trusting Christ to forgive, change, guide, and satisfy us.

In the New Covenant we all know God (11)

Not everyone in the whole world — but everyone in the New Covenant We can actually know God!

In the New Covenant we are completely forgiven (12) Through Jesus' death on the Cross


God's promise of a New Covenant shows that the Old Covenant is obsolete and vanishing away.
