
The Letter To The Hebrews Why We Must Hold Fast To Our Hope Hebrews 3:6b-11



How can we know that we are God's house — God's saved people? (3:6b)

We can tell that we are part of God's saved people IF we are holding fast to our hope.

So assurance of salvation is not mostly a matter of looking at a past decision; it's a matter of looking at our hearts now.

What does it mean to hold fast to our hope? (3:6b)

- **Hope** means a rock-solid certainty that your future is amazing. This refers to being in the new heavens and earth with all the redeemed worshiping Jesus Christ (3:1; 13:14)
- **Confidence** means you can be certain the new heavens and earth will be real because God has given you evidence in history, and in your own experience.
- **Boasting** means delighting, rejoicing, looking forward to this hope more than to anything else.

But some of his readers were not holding fast their confidence and boasting in their hope; and didn't think there was any problem with their salvation. That might be true of us as well.

How does he warn them — and us? (3:7-11)

Even though God had done wonderful things for Israel — because of their sinful hearts He swore that they would not enter his rest.


If we are not holding fast to our hope, we might not be saved. And if we continue in this state, we might not enter God's rest.

What can we do?

Understand that God can change your heart (Heb 13:20-21)

Come to Jesus as you are, confessing your sin, pleading for His help (Heb 4:16)

Pray over God's Word until you feel Jesus changing your heart (Rom 10:17).

What questions did Sunday's message raise in your mind?
