Introduction

The Christian life is all about faith in Jesus Christ. Everything we are called to be and do is said to come through faith. So it's crucial that we understand what faith is, and how it works. Those questions are answered in Heb 11:1-2.

What is faith? (v.1)

Some take this verse to mean that faith means having assurance and conviction of biblical truth. Faith does mean that. But this verse seems to say something more.

How is faith the assurance of things hoped for? (v.1)

The word "assurance" means the substance, or the reality, of something.

How is faith the substance of things hoped for? It's that when we have faith, God will sometimes give us an actual taste of His presence and His reality.

How is faith the conviction of things not seen? (vv.1-2)

The word "conviction" means evidence or proof.

How is faith the evidence of things not seen?

V.2 gives the reason for how faith gives us evidence that God is really there —


It's because God will sometimes give us a commendation that we are pleasing to Him — personal assurance that we are saved..

<u>Is that really what this verse means?</u>

Other Bible teachers say the same thing. Heb 10:19 and 6:19 illustrate this. David Brainerd is an example of this.
